Climate action is in our DNA. The School of Climate Action is committed to educating the climate leaders, innovators and problem solvers of tomorrow. Through applied learning diplomas and micro-credentials our learners are building meaningful careers in environmental technology and biotechnology. The Gina Fraser Research Chair in Skilled Trades for the Green Economy, the first in Canada, aims to connect students with businesses and community to develop impactful projects and advance the green sector.

Canadian Colleges for a Resilient Recovery (C2R2)

As a leader and founding member of the pan-Canadian colleges initiative, Mohawk is committed to advancing a sustainable and resilient economy through workforce training, applied research and community

leadership. The 15-member coalition has supported over 20,000 learners, engaged over 1,000 employers, developed 124 training courses, and directly impacted 22 First Nations communities since it was formed in 2020. The coalition is a driving force, providing the skills required to transition to a clean economy in Canada.

Centre for Climate Change Management (CCCM)

CCCM co-develops solutions with industry, government and local communities. The Low Carbon Readiness Program (LCRP) provides consultancy services to Canadian small and medium-size businesses on how to reduce their carbon footprint.
