Greetings,

On behalf of Civil Air Patrol and its Board of Governors, I am pleased to present to you our 2020 Annual Report. This annual report touts the vigilant efforts of our 54,000 citizen volunteers in the past fiscal year

in which CAP's response to the COVID-19 pandemic became the organization's largest mobilization since World War II.



During the pandemic, our members used their professional knowledge, skills and expertise to fulfill CAP's U.S. Air Force auxiliary role of Defense Support of Civil Authorities to meet the demands of local, state and federal agencies. Our humanitarian relief efforts, detailed on the opening pages of this report, involved more than 40 CAP wings performing over 120 COVID-19-related missions nationwide. Those missions included delivering (and even making) personal protective equipment (PPE), building temporary hospitals and other facilities, expediting deliveries of kits, samples and vials of vaccine to labs in rural areas,

delivering or serving meals, staffing emergency operations centers and Points of Distribution (PODs), and hosting blood drives to help meet a critical need for the American Red Cross.

CAP accomplished much in support of America during this crisis while also meeting the search and rescue, emergency services and homeland security needs of the Air Force — our Total Force partner. In addition, our volunteers maintained a leading role in aerospace education, using national academic standards-based aviation/STEM education, and served as outstanding mentors to over 20,000 young people participating in CAP's cadet programs despite the challenges imposed by COVID-19.

As CAP's national commander and CEO, I must say how very proud I am of this unprecedented effort, which was achieved in the middle of a pandemic under the most demanding of circumstances.

The words of Lt. Gen. Kirk S. Pierce, commander, First Air Force, Air Forces Northern, sums up our performance in 2020: "CAP has successfully risen to meet the needs of the nation during the pandemic. As a Total Force partner, CAP seamlessly complements our efforts. They provide exceptional capability and capacity to assist the Air Force and our citizens during this national crisis."

This annual report also reflects Civil Air Patrol's emphasis on philanthropy, which comes from the Board of Governors' commitment to the future of our great organization. Its effect is reflected in a multipage list of our donors that you will find in this report. This list is led by the 2020 Commander's Circle (beginning on page 26), which lists donors of \$1,000 or more.

The fact that our donor list managed to grow during such a challenging year speaks to the generosity of CAP members and others who contribute to our important missions. Your donations are vital to the growth of CAP and its impact, and we appreciate your efforts.

The expanding donor list is also a reflection on our development team, which achieved the trifecta of charity review recognition this past year — just in time for the current giving season. Achieving accreditation by the BBB Wise Giving Alliance complemented our receiving the GuideStar Platinum seal and the "Give with Confidence" Seal from Charity Navigator. These achievements signify that CAP is a well-run organization deserving of donor trust. With this charity review accomplishment, CAP is demonstrating our commitment to sound governance, transparency and achieving our mission while also earning the public's trust.

With such measures in place, the Civil Air Patrol Foundation is experiencing growth in endowments, which are critical to CAP's financial health. Those gifts are also listed in this report (on page 43). Ten trustees now serve on the foundation board, which helps manage these funds in support of the organization and its membership. In the past year, I was blessed to do my part — giving to create the Semper Vigilans Society. You can learn more about this on page 20.

Finally, you will find a summary of Civil Air Patrol's financials. This statement on pages 18-19 is the culmination of CAP's 13th consecutive unmodified audit. Auditors providing the unmodified audit opinion emphasized its importance: "Financial transparency and accountability are essential for a not-for-profit organization to succeed in these unpresented times. An unmodified audit opinion helps demonstrate both."

Truly, Civil Air Patrol is a solid investment in America and its communities, returning \$4 in service for every \$1 in funding it receives. With more than \$193 million in volunteer hours benefiting the nation in 2020, it is easy to see why CAP is recognized as one of the premier public service organizations in the United States.

That reputation for service is made possible through the support of the Air Force and Civil Air Patrol's growing number of generous donors, who include many of our members as well as others who contributed to our missions during the past year. Your unwavering support ensures that CAP will be able to continue to serve well into the future. Thank you.

COVID-19

'Our Largest Campaign Since World War II'

he U.S. Air Force's newest Total Force partner proved its worth as a force-multiplier in 2020, more than living up to its reputation as one of the nation's premier humanitarian service organizations. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Civil Air Patrol stood out by providing emergency services,

humanitarian relief, educational programs and a variety of youth development initiatives amid unforeseen challenges.

Initially, not knowing how it would be asked to respond, CAP took the necessary steps to protect its 60,000 members by socially distancing and eventually curtailing in-person meetings and activities. Soon, calls began coming into the National Operations Center at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama.

At first the missions were fairly basic, like taking aerial photographs of temporary drive-through testing facilities to document traffic flow. Then came requests to transport test kits by air to expedite the virus detection process, along with many more missions assigned by the Air Force — some of which required new processes and procedures, like sanitizing vehicles and aircraft between missions and safely loading and transporting kits to labs before and after testing.

"Given the scope and diversity of missions assigned in a Defense Support of Civil Authorities capacity, CAP's capacity as a Total Force partner has proven to be an invaluable resource.

The nation heavily relies on the CAP's ability to support community, state, and federal agencies during this pandemic," said Lt. Gen. Kirk S. Pierce, commander, First Air Force, Air Forces Northern, which approves most CAP operational missions performed in its role as the Air Force auxiliary.

Through September, more than 40 wings were tasked with COVID-19 duties, such as decontaminating ambulances, delivering personal command centers, expediting test >>

protective equipment (PPE) to rural locations, building temporary hospitals and other facilities, staffing emergency operations centers, delivering or serving meals, making PPE, hauling mobile

samples to labs, conducting aerial photography and using unit locations for blood drives for the American Red Cross.

"No matter how you slice it duration, level of effort, or scope — Civil Air Patrol's COVID-19 response is our largest campaign since World War II," CAP's national commander, Maj. Gen. Mark Smith, told CAP members less than four months into their response to the pandemic. "I am

so impressed with our volunteers and our staff for the amazing work that is being done across the organization, from working points of distribution to flying test samples to virtual meeting aerospace activities to wing administrators to our national staff."

In September, CAP joined Operation Warp Speed to transport COVID-19 vaccines to rural areas of the country. \triangle

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Technology Ushers in **New Capabilities**

ivil Air Patrol's search and rescue capabilities were elevated in 2020 through the use of cellphone forensic software and radar analysis tools developed and updated by CAP members. Using this technology, CAP finished the fiscal year with 130 lives saved, making it one of the most productive years ever for the organization's search and rescue efforts.

In its role as the U.S. Air Force auxiliary and as a Total Force partner, CAP also conducts disaster relief, air defense training and other critical missions for America. Aircrews flew more than 70,000 hours in 2020 in CAP's large and capable fleet of single-engine planes. More than 75% of these flying hours came on Air Force-assigned missions.

Technology, both old and new, helped in the performance of these missions, some related to the COVID-19 missions mentioned earlier in this report. Recent advances in aerial photography greatly enhanced CAP's disaster relief responses in 2020, helping aircrews provide valuable 3D imagery to the Federal Emergency Management Agency. WaldoAir camera pods were used early in the fiscal year as part of the Puerto Rico Wing's earthquake response and continued into a busier-than-usual hurricane season along the Gulf of Mexico before ending with wildfires in Cali-

CAP also purchased and fielded new small Unmanned Aerial Systems, boasting nearly 2,000 sUAS toward year's end — all meeting Department of Defense standards that allow for sUAS in the nation and is a leader in the growing remotely piloted aircraft world. \triangle



Forensics provided by CAP's National Radar Analysis Team helped the U.S. Coast Guard and Bahamian authorities find an aircraft down in the Atlantic Ocean near the Bahamas. The pilot was rescued by the Coast Guard. The 130 lives CAP was credited with saving in 2020 ranked fifth behind the total for fiscal 2018 (a record 158 saves).



Using cellphone data, CAP's National Cell Phone Forensics Team guided U.S. Coast Guard searchers to this "most likely area" in Washington state, where they found a missing 39-year-old hiker who had fallen into the subfreezing Hoh River. Most of the 130 lives saved in 2020 resulted from the cellphone forensics team's efforts.





The WaldoAir technology used by CAP's well-trained professional volunteers provided damage assessment both in the air and on the ground. WaldoAir's ground camera was first used to provide imagery following earthquakes in Puerto Rico. CAP's sUAS were also used to collect Lidar damage assessment and comparison.

Small Unmanned Aerial Systems Program



CAP is developing a remotely piloted aircraft path for cadets operating sUAS to the service academies or universities and beyond. To that end, CAP is expanding its partnerships with NASA, the FAA and multiple universities nationwide. This fledgling program is just the beginning and provides the opportunity for CAP in the rapidly evolving world of RPA.



CAP, acting in its role as the U.S. Air Force auxiliary, provides counter-sUAS mission support for military bases throughout the U.S. Members use established capabilities, like aerial photography illustrated here, to conduct these missions.



A photo taken from a CAP sUAS captures 1st Lt. Emmary Webb preparing to catch the InstantEye quadcopter being flown by Lt. Col. John Webb, both of the New York Wing. The landing gear had to be removed so it wouldn't be seen in the camera images because of the way the camera was positioned. The incident commander can authorize an experienced technician to catch the aircraft when the landing gear is removed.

AEROSPACE EDUCATION

Aviation/STEM Education Fuels Imaginations

TEM (science, technology, engineering and math) education with an aerospace theme is the cornerstone of Civil Air Patrol's Aerospace Education mission, laying a firm foundation for CAP cadets and students nationwide.

Of the 20 STEM Kits designed by CAP for squadrons and K-12 educators, three of them are focused on the skills,

piloted vehicles. Students as young as 10 can begin using CAP's Ready-to-Fly Quadcopter, where they can also apply skills learned through that kit and the other sUAS-related STEM Kits. There is also Flight Simulator, which provides cadets and students the opportunity to practice their flying skills they can apply later to earn Federal Aviation Administration private pilot certificates.

These STEM Kits — available to
Civil Air Patrol cadets and a growing
number of students taught by CAP's
aerospace education members —
inspire imagination and are making an
impact on hundreds of thousands

of students each year. The kits are increasing interest in STEM as well as aviation, and more are in the works.

The STEM Kits and other AE curricula products are also used in CAP's Aerospace Connections in Education (ACE) program, which now involves more than 76,500 kindergarten through sixth-grade students in more than 500 schools nationwide. Every CAP wing now has at least one ACE program. △








AE Curricula








AE's impressive catalog of curricula was greatly enhanced over the past year. The staff developed a second Women in Aviation curriculum module, including biographies and hands-on activities. They also developed two additional AE Excellence curriculum modules with over 25 hands-on activities and updated over 150 new curriculum lesson plans to accompany the ACE program for elementary teachers.

ACE Liftoff



Civil Air Patrol's Aerospace Connections in Education (ACE) program for grades K-6 launched the 2020-2021 academic year in the fall with a national liftoff held at Silver Sands School in Fort Walton Beach, Florida. Silver Sands School hosted the liftoff after being named CAP's 2020 National ACE School of the Year out of 517 schools. The school, which serves special needs students from pre-K through 12th grade, interwove the ACE program throughout its classes, adjusting lessons to accommodate all students during the pandemic.

CADET PROGRAMS

Our Cadets Learn to Fly, Even in Challenging Year The opportunity to fly in a powered aircraft or glider, even a hot-air balloon, is one of Civil Air Patrol's top attractions for young people, providing many young cadets with their introduction to flight. That is especially true today as CAP's Cadet Programs has intensified youth aviation training in

response to a developing worldwide shortage of pilots in both the military and commercial sectors.

The Cadet Wings program offers opportunities for cadets to solo and acquire their private pilot certificates after training with certified flight instructors. Despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, 22 CAP cadets soloed and earned their private pilot certificates through the program in 2020.

Related CAP programs are offered for youth interested in exploring aviation, including the Take-Off program, which provides financial assistance for cadets to participate in CAP's weeklong powered and glider flight academies. Though most of those were canceled in the past year, there is optimism that they can be ramped back up in the coming year. In 2019, 25 flight academies were held at 18 locations nationwide. \triangle




StellarXplorers



National Commander Helps Launch Semper Vigilans Society

n expression that Maj. Gen. Mark Smith uses to describe a golden opportunity that shouldn't be missed is "ticket to the game."

By including Civil Air Patrol in his planned giving, Smith is providing a fistful of tickets to hand out to young people who might not otherwise have the opportunity to benefit from CAP's leadership and enrichment programs. He's pleased to be in a position to help financially.

"It makes a difference in the life of a young person," Smith said. "That's the beauty and the power of philanthropy."

Smith, who retired in 2000 after a 26-year U.S. Air Force career, will conclude his extended four-year term as national commander and CEO of Civil Air Patrol in August. Numerous advancements and improvements have occurred under his leadership, including the launch of the Semper Vigilans Society in 2020. The society was established to recognize those who include CAP in their estate planning.

Kristina Jones, CAP's chief of philanthropy, credited Smith with developing a philanthropic culture during his tenure. When he decided to make a lasting impact on CAP through planned giving, Jones wasn't surprised.

"It is exactly the kind of heart he has always had for our cadets and our amazing organization," she said. "We knew he wanted to lead by example."

In turn, Smith gives much of the credit to Jones and her development team for strengthening the CAP Foundation. Through new ideas from the team, such as the Semper Vigilans Society, the foundation is approaching the \$2 million mark.

"Without their hard work," Smith said, "none of this would be happening."

Semper Vigilans, Civil Air Patrol's motto, is Latin for "always vigilant" or "always ready." Planned giving to the foundation ensures CAP is always ready for the future. CAP's mission can be summarized as "saving lives and shaping lives," Smith said. Including CAP in estate planning will help ensure that continues.

Developing young people into competent, confident leaders is especially important to Smith, who benefited as a youngster when he was aided in his dream of becoming a fighter pilot. The Air Force Academy liaison for the area where Smith grew up saw potential in the young man and assisted him in reaching his goal.

Smith was accepted into the academy and graduated with a bachelor's degree in international affairs. That experience made him realize the importance of good role models in the lives of young people.

"The power of mentorship is something that is really important to me," Smith said.

Today, he's in a position to help provide those mentors. He joined Civil Air Patrol in 2005, but after active-duty service that included Operation Desert Storm and commanding the Air Force's 27th Fighter Squadron, Smith wasn't sure he would be a good fit for a civilian organization.

But he fell in love with the people he met, and he saw a way to continue his passion for developing leaders.

"That was the hook that kept me in," Smith said.

Texas 'CAP Family' Honors Son

Rick Schroder grew from a boy with a keen mind and a sharp sense of humor into a focused young man. He drew on his intellect to turn an interest in science and aviation into a rewarding career, and much of the credit goes to his involvement with Civil Air Patrol, starting at age 13.

Thanks to his parents, Col. William and Maj. Valerie Schroder, other youngsters also will have an opportunity to experience CAP and be exposed to many rewarding career opportunities in Nick's honor.

Nick died Aug. 12, 2019, in Midwest City, Oklahoma, at age 26. He was a mechanical engineer at Tinker Air Force Base. To celebrate his life and honor his memory, Nick's parents have endowed the Capt. Nick Schroder Cadet Scholarship through Civil Air Patrol to help provide opportunities to other cadets also interested in exploring career paths in aviation.

"I'm glad that we can do this as a perpetual memorial," his father said.

The scholarship will support a collegeor academy-bound cadet majoring in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics (STEM) field. The fund also will support two cadets who attend CAP National Cadet Special Activities each year, providing them with opportunities to learn and grow in a chosen field.

"CAP Cadet Programs is designed to influence young people like Nick to be dynamic Americans and aerospace leaders through cadet engagement, physical activities, and in developing leadership skills," said Margarita Mesones, manager of CAP's cadet aviation career activities.

Kristina Jones, CAP's chief of philanthropy, said the Schroder family embodies the term "CAP family," with both parents being active members. Bill Schroder is Texas Wing commander; Val fills multiple duty positions with the Lakeshore Composite Squadron and Group II.

Jones said Bill and Val shared how
involvement with Civil Air Patrol
changed Nick's life from being a "couch
potato" to an energetic young man.

"I am so grateful the Schroders have chosen to establish a scholarship in his name, which has the opportunity to provide the same life-changing opportunities for cadets in the future," Iones said.

Once Nick followed his parents into CAP, he was all in.

"He loved CAP," Val said. "That's where his joy was."

Nick's first national activity, at age 14, was the Advanced Technologies Academy in Colorado. He ended his cadet career as a cadet lieutenant colonel, just missing the Gen. Carl A. Spaatz Award — CAP's highest cadet honor — by one exam when he turned 21.

The scholarship in Nick's honor was funded through his life insurance and donations, including \$10,000 given by family and friends. His parents are grateful for the support from Civil Air Patrol as well.

CREATING A BRIGHTER FUTURE

Squadron Founding Member Leaves Transformational Gift as a Legacy

The loyalty and generosity of a charter member of Civil Air Patrol's Nellis Senior Squadron was on full display at a banquet on Jan. 12, 2020, in Las Vegas when a gift of \$450,721 was made official.

The gift from the Charles and Lenke N. Tarr Fund came 20 years after Charles' death. It was one of 17 gifts distributed at the banquet, all to organizations and charities that Tarr supported during his 84 years of life.

"Charlie's dream was to make this a better world," said Jerry Engel, who first met Tarr in the 1950s when both men were new to Las Vegas. The two became friends, and Engel, a certified public accountant, suggested to Tarr that he establish a trust fund. Engel served as a trustee of the fund from its inception until its closing.

The Nellis Senior Squadron was formed in 1988, and over the years Charles Tarr served in many capacities. He was a natural fit for Civil Air Patrol, having flown B-17 bombers in 42 missions during World War II.

When Tarr died Dec. 31, 1999, he left a sizable trust. For the first 19 years of

the fund, gifts of either \$500 or \$1,000 were distributed annually among the 17 recipients. The Nellis Senior Squadron received \$1,000 annually. The remainder of the fund, totaling \$5.4 million, was distributed at the January banquet.

The \$450,721 designated for the Nellis Senior Squadron will be managed by the Civil Air Patrol Foundation. The gift is the first endowment dedicated to supporting a local unit, said Kristina Jones, CAP's chief of philanthropy.

"We are glad to offer the foundation as a manager of these types of gifts, which are intended to have a meaningful impact for years to come," Jones said. Lt. Col. Malcolm Arnot, deputy commander of the Nellis squadron, talked about future uses of the proceeds during the January banquet.

"The donation means a great deal to the Nellis Senior Squadron in that it will allow the squadron to provide meaningful and robust training to all our members and provide mission support to our operations," Arnot said.

Some of the funds will be used for muchneeded renovations, repairs and upgrades to the operations center, which is located at North Las Vegas Airport. The facility houses the Nellis squadron's two aircraft and is used by other CAP squadrons in southern Nevada.


