Through the work of the Digital Convergence Accelerated Cohort, students and staff across the Little Falls School District have collaborated, creating shared vision statements. From these shared statements, students and staff have collaborated in the creation of classroom codes and the development of standard operating procedures.

Jamie Adams


Verndale Elementary School
