


Bryan Syrstad


Cley Twigg

These children arrive without the ability to self-regulate or communicate their needs, and without the knowledge of how to co-exist with peers. The team develops and executes plans to support those needs, helps students express the big feelings that are stuck in their little bodies, and provides the skills to make friends.

The team also teaches children how to move their bodies and learn the pre-academic skills that will prepare them to be successful in kindergarten and beyond.

Donna Yliniemi


Sebeka Elementary School
