## Lightbulb was spy camera

An Auckland bridesmaid and a wedding photographer were “shocked” to discover a lightbulb in a West Auckland short-term rental home was actually a hidden camera. Photographer Michael Kouk said he visited a bridal party at a home in Taupaki, West Auckland, on Saturday morning. Kouk and a bridesmaid noticed an “odd” lightbulb in the centre of the open dining room and connected living room that had a black dot in the middle of it, he said. The bridesmaid unscrewed the lightbulb and the pair were “pretty shocked” and “angry” to discover a camera inside, he said. Kouk posted about the incident on social media, stating the lightbulb was a “Spy 360 Degree Camera”. Kouk believed a report had been made to police. Booking.com has been approached for comment.
